In March we held a Training day at Stokenchurch HQ. We arranged a number of activities some involving teamwork, others group discussion, all to have fun. The first activity was in patrols, to make a shelter out of paper and sticky tape...We then looked at designs for a gateway, one of the popular ideas being to have a sheet to enable Scouts from around the world to sign. The unit went on a short hike, and even the member on crutches made their way round, in true team spirit style. Possibly the main activity, or at least the most noisy was that of Taiko Drumming. Alison Green a local Scout and Guide leader got us all taking part in this Japanese art, I think she thought we were too British in our drumming though... not loud enough. We continued with badge designing. Last but not least Stuart created lunch Japanese style, Miso soup with noodles followed by Sushi, everyone tried some of each; at the Jamboree we are probably going to eat traditional Japanese food. One comment overheard was 'I don't like this much, but with practice I might get to'......
